

School Board Standing Pat On Busing Moves

FARMINGTON Bloomfield and Bloomfield Hills are placed in a cluster with the Detroit Ford and Mumford attendance areas.

ACTING ON the opinion of the board's attorney, Robert J. Kelly, the board is waiting to take action until a final court order is signed for a metropolitan desegregation plan.

Board President Kenneth Perrin said he expected that a final order would be signed sometime around July 29, when Judge Roth is expected to have completed all final information.

Perrin added that the board's position is "to oppose by any means we legally have any court ordered busing in which Farmington is declared a participant."

Although the Roth panel hasn't made any direct requests for information from the Farmington district, Perrin said the district did provide the Oakland Intermediate School District with information on buses because "we always work with them."

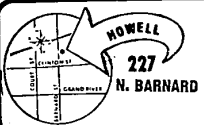

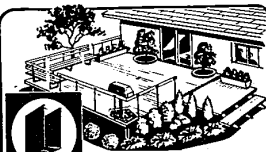

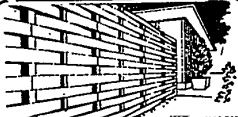
