And a sizable chunk of Livonia's history is deposited in the charming two-story "salt-box" house that is just a stone's throw from one of the city's busiest thoroughfares.

(In fact, it's just down the road from the new home of the Observer Newspapers -- once the site of Mrs. Clemens' girlhood home. Her family bought the property somewhere around 1915 from the pioneer Gates family, described in a feature story in the July 5 edition by Observer Women's Editor Margaret Miller.)

It's a pleasant place to visit.

"VASELINE" glass (named for its color and texture) candlestick holders gleam on a window ledge. flanked by one-white insulators turned blue by the sun's rays. Nearby are a rare cranberry glass pickle jar and a "Buster Brown' sugar and creamer set.

The visitor's eye is drawn to the extremely rare pressed glass fruit compote in the "log cabin" or Canadian design and the "Garfield drape" pitcher, a commemorative piece marking President Garfield's death presented to Mrs. Clemens at her retirement after 10 years as a first grade teacher at Livonia's Garfield Elementary School.
