Women on the Go
Home And Flowers
Keep Her Busy

Joyce Herrington of Farmington loves houses and trees and flowers and gets her fill of all in the life style she's chosen.

She and her husband, Lloyd, and their daughter and son, Heather and Garth, live in an old home they've been remodeling totally for eight years now.

"They had it picked up from a well-traveled Farmington corner and set down on a narrow road where there are woods and meadows close by.

The fields give Joyce an ample supply of flowers to dry for the floral pieces she makes and the classes in arranging she teaches and the house gives both husband and wife an outlet for all sorts of creative decorative ideas.

"We'd build an old-looking house if we were starting over," she said. "Living in the middle of remodeling for years can be pretty difficult."

Nevertheless, she has found a lot of satisfaction in seeing emerge slowly as time and funds permitted—a living room full of refinished antiques and often candlelit, a dining room with an old wood-burning stove and huge bunches of field flowers and grasses hanging to dry, a full-bricked bathroom and a paneled kitchen with plenty of shelves.

"We did all the electrical work and the plumbing and lowered the ceiling," Joyce said.

When completed—a condition still well in the future as Joyce sees it—the home will be fully paneled outside and surrounded by brick walks.

Also partially completed are a greenhouse and a playhouse that serves as an overflow room for Heather, now 13, and three-year-old Garth.

JOYCE HERRINGTON, who studied art and has done painting and worked in other media, has recently concentrated on arranging flowers, both fresh and dried. Niece of a former President of the Women's National Home and Garden Association, Joyce learned long ago to love flowers but started arranging them fairly recently.

"People wanted to learn to make them as well as buying them," Joyce said. So she began teaching flower arranging for the Western Wayne YWCA, and also holds occasional classes in her home.

Joyce also likes to work with fresh flowers and the biggest project to date was putting together five large arrangements and more than 60 small ones for the Institute of Arts afterglow that followed the opening of the Metropolitan Opera season in Detroit this spring.
