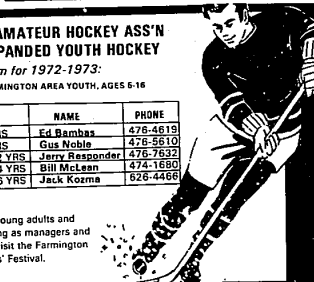

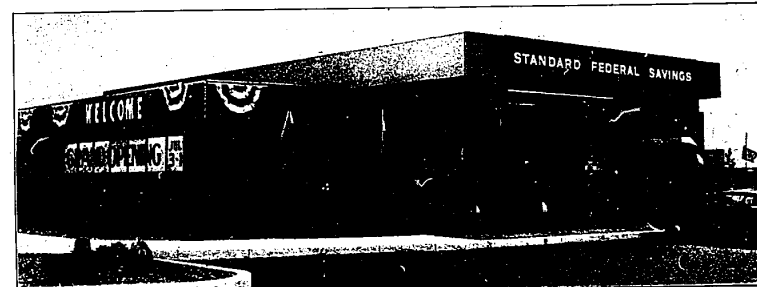
The students, ranging in age from 16 to 21 years old will arrive at USC June 19 and will remain there until mid-August.
