# Farmers Honored At '74 FFF?

Farmington Township Supervisor Earl Teeplees thought it would be nice to honor Farmington's 13 remaining original farmers at the Founders Festival July 27 through July 29.

He gave a memo to that effect to his secretary and she gave it to "someone, I don't remember who" on the Festival Committee.

Teeplees even started making plaques for the farmers out of memorabilia he found "bumming around" — a sheep bell plaque for a sheep farmer, a tag from an early bag of potatoes for a potato farmer, some door knobs from another farmer's barn.

He said he was making the plaques in his workshop and wanted to present them to the farmers at a breakfast or luncheon — ceremoniously, with a handshake to make their day pleasant and warm.

But his memo never got to the top of the festival committee. In fact nobody knows where the memo went.

Committee chairman John Ogurek and vice-chairman Bob Beauchamp said it was a good idea but didn't know anything about it.

Ogurek suggested the farmers could be better honored at Farmington's 150th anniversary celebration in 1974.

"We've already started planning that one," he said. "It's going to be a biggie."

"Okay," Teeplees said when the three men finally got together through a conference telephone call Wednesday, "do it in 1974."

"I'm still enthused," he said, "I'm looking up little goodies for the plaques which will bring tears to the farmers' eyes."
