

Tennis Club Breaks Ground

Ground was officially broken this week for the \$1 million Southdowns indoor tennis club to be constructed in the Farmington Freeway industrial park.

Excavations began two weeks ago for the facility which will contain eight tennis courts in two buildings, joined by a service complex with shops, lockerrooms and a health club.

The complex is scheduled to open in November.

Southdowns President Hans Hafemeister said he expects the year-round courts to attract players from the more than 60 light manufacturing plants and the housing developments in the area as well as guests from a nearby Holiday Inn.

"The manager shall be appointed on his training and his executive and administrative qualifications," the proposed section reads. It was passed unanimously.

The city council may also have the power to appoint the clerk, treasurer and assessor upon the recommendation of the city manager.

The commission also recommended the Board of Review be appointed by the council.

The appointment or hiring of the remainder of the city officials, particularly the police chief, was not agreed on, and a research committee was appointed to investigate the procedure in surrounding communities.

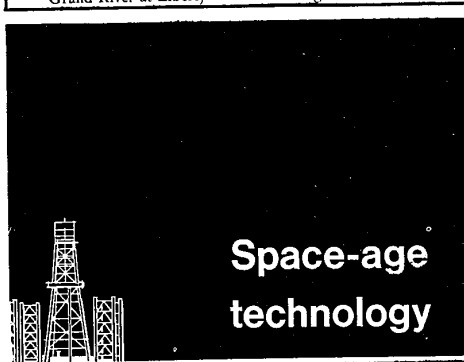
