Following the luncheon, the group enjoyed singing and games, and then toured the home. Their tour included the new Crippen Memorial Building and the arts and crafts department.

The home is an agency of the Detroit Methodist Conference. Established in 1906, its purpose was to care for the physical, spiritual, mental and social needs of the family.

It now houses some 250 retired persons.

The four-year liberal arts college, one of three Orchard Lake schools, offers 40 different courses of study.

The Piney Woods Singers, a male quartet from the Piney Woods Country Life School in Mississippi, will make three appearances for Farmington groups during the coming week.

Their first concert of spirituals and sacred music will be offered at 10 a.m. Sunday, July 30, in Antioch Lutheran Church, 13 Mile and Farmington Road.

The FOUR young men ranging in age from 15 to 19 also will appear at meetings of the Farmington Rotary Club at 12 noon Tuesday, Aug. 1, and for the North Farmington Kiwanis Club at 12:15 p.m. Tuesday, Aug. 8.

Under the direction of Thomas Jefferson Pruitt, the quartet is touring several northern states to tell the story of the unusual Piney Woods school.

It was started in an old log cabin on a grazing meadow in southeastern Mississippi 58 years ago by Dr. Lawrence C. Jones, founder of a number of schools including two in Michigan.

DESIGNED to bring basic education to the children of share-croppers and indigent mountain people in Mississippi, it incorporates in its six-year program the four high school grades and two years of business junior college.

Fr. Wotta Retires

The Rev. Andrew J. Wotta, a mathematics teacher for Saint Mary's Preparatory, has retired after 50 years of teaching in the Orchard Lake Schools. He was honored at the last faculty meeting of the schools in June for his years of dedication and service.

Born in Bronson, Father Wotta came to Orchard Lake in 1915 and was ordained to the priesthood 46 years ago. He has a sister, Sister Matilda, who has been a Felician nun for 66 years. She is currently in the infirmary at Madonna College, Livonia.

Father Wotta plans to spend his time visiting relatives across the country and fishing. In one winter, he caught more than 1,500 bluegills in the northern half of Orchard Lake.

Father Wotta began his teaching career at Saint Mary's Preparatory and Saint Mary's College while still in his first year of theology at Saint Cyril and Methodius Seminary. Besides teaching mathematics, he has also served as principal of Saint Mary's, dean of the college and college basketball and basketball coach.
