Oakland County 4-H Fair Runs Aug. 7-12

A new location and many new attractions are features of this year's Oakland County 4-H Fair set for Aug. 7-12. The Springfield-Oaks Youth Activities Center, located on Andersonville Road near Davisburg, is the new home of the 4-H fair.

Among the new attractions are a free baby animal farm for the youngsters. The miniature farm will include 15 different babies, many of which can be touched and even fed by the children at dinner-time.

For the oldesters, an old-fashioned horse pulling contest will be included at the Saturday evening free show. Other free evening shows will include a magic show, Punch and Judy, the State Fair Singers, Mr. Patches and Billy Bumpkin and their puppet theater, horse contest events, a balloon artist and Los Caballos Danzantes Horse Drill Team.

Thousands of exhibits, including all kinds of livestock and horses, will be on display, and the midway will have 17 rides.

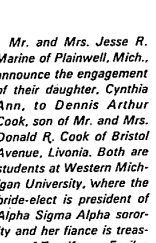
Miss Gearn's Wed In Washington

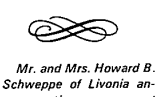

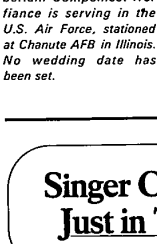
