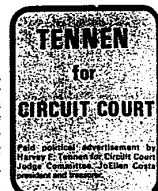


64th District Will Represent Farmington



FARMINGTON Two Democrats face a runoff in the Aug. 8 primary to decide which one will oppose incumbent Rep. Raymond L. Baker (R-Farmington) in the general election for the 64th State House District seat.

The candidates for the 64th District were given the opportunity to respond to a questionnaire compiled by the League of Women Voters of Oakland County.

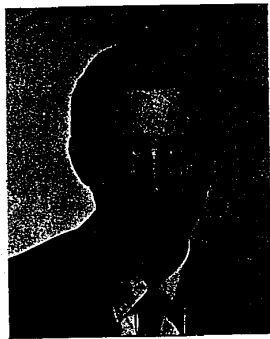
