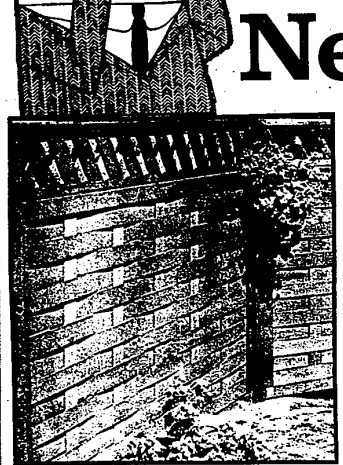
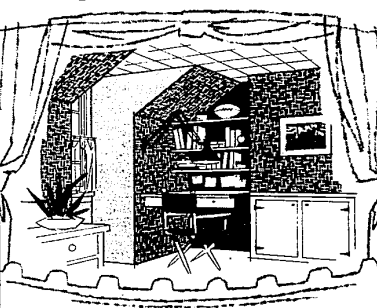

Highway Projects Started

Work has begun on four highway projects totaling \$3.37 million in Garden City, Westland and Livonia, according to Sen. William Faust (D-Westland).

A 1.4 mile stretch of Middle Belt Rd. from Michigan Ave. north will be completed in November at a cost of \$1.4 million. The project includes widening, paving, grading and drainage structures and construction of a three-span bridge to carry Middle Belt over the Lower Rouge River in Inkster.

Two miles of Cherry Hill will be widened from US-24 west in Garden City, Westland and Inkster at a cost of \$1.56 million. The project is due for completion in November.

Improvements at the intersection of Merriman Rd. and Marquette Ave. in Garden City are being financed by federal funds at a \$210,000 cost. The project will be completed in September.

Also due for completion in September are improvements to the intersections of Wayne and Joy Rds., Wayne and Ann Arbor Trail, and Wayne and Plymouth Rd. in Livonia and Westland. The \$170,000 project is financed with federal funds.

Stolen Goods Proposal OK'd By Senate

LANSING

Proposed legislation requiring that persons who receive stolen goods must prove they thought the items were legitimate passed the Senate with approval from two Observeland senators.

Sen. William Faust (D-Westland) and Sen. Carl Pursell (R-Plymouth) both voted for the bill, which passed 23-9 and was sent to Gov. Milliken for signature. The bill had passed the House several months ago.

Sen. David Plawewski (D-Dearborn Heights) voted against the bill, and Sen. Daniel Cooper (D-Oak Park) was absent.

The bill would make the receiver of stolen goods liable for the same penalty as the thief.

Supporters argued that it would dry up the market for the goods and discourage young people from attempting to make easy money through selling stolen goods.

Opponents argued that the bill presumes the person guilty until he proves his innocence.

Lower Huron Swim Meet Set For Kids

The 12th annual Lower Huron Class A swim meet will be held Wednesday and Thursday, Aug. 9 and 10, at the pool of Lower Metropolitan Park near Belleville.

Boys and girls, ages 17 and under, are eligible to compete in the AAU sanctioned, all-time finals, beginning at 5 p.m. on Wednesday and continuing at 9 a.m. Thursday until completion of all events.

Medals, provided by the Huron-Clinton Metropolitan Authority, will be awarded to first, second and third place winners, while fourth through seventh place winners will receive ribbons, according to Park Supl. George Giblin.

Mrs. Sally Prior, of Orchard Lake, general swim chairman of Amateur Athletic Union and chairman of Junior Olympic Swim Committee, is the meet director.

Assisting Mrs. Prior are members of the Mercy Aquatic Club of Farmington.

Early registration for fall quarter classes at Wayne State University is currently underway and will continue through Friday, Aug. 11.

Students may register in alphabetical order at the Administrative Services Building, Cass and Antioch, from 8 a.m. to noon and 1:30 to 6:30 p.m. on Mondays and Thursdays, and from 8 a.m. to noon and 1:30 to 4:30 p.m. on Tuesdays, Wednesdays and Fridays. The fall quarter begins Sept. 18.
