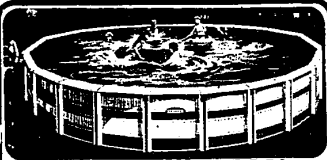

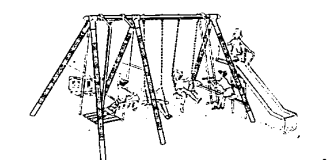

State Sen. Daniel Cooper (D-Oak Park) and State Rep. Marvin Stempien (D-Livonia), both recent winners of Democratic nominations for Congressional seats have outspent themselves in postage costs for the first half of 1972.

Cooper, nominee in the 18th Congressional District, topped the list of Senate mailing expenses by spending \$7,860 in the first six months of 1972. He topped all the senators last year spending \$11,943 for all of 1971.

Stempien, nominated for the 2nd Congressional seat, spent \$7,381 for the first half of this year compared to \$6,947 for 1971.

Postage bills for other Observeland senators were \$3,044 in 1972 compared to \$1,638 in 1971 for Sen. William Faust (D-Westland), \$5,058 in 1972 and \$6,295 in 1971 for Sen. David Plawocki (D-Deborn Heights); and \$2,888 in 1972 and \$543 in 1971 for Sen. Carl Pursell (R-Plymouth).

In the State House, where all the legislators are engaged in re-election campaigns, the postage bill is already \$6,000 higher for the first six months of 1972 than the \$210,610 spent all last year.

Expenses for local representatives in the first six months of 1972 and for all 1971 are as follows: Raymond Baker (R-Farmington) \$147 for 1972, \$201 for 1971; John Bennett (D-Redford Township) \$3,821 in 1972, \$4,295 in 1971; Thomas Brown (D-Westland) \$3,258, \$206 in 1971; James Defebaugh (R-Birmingham) \$153 for 1972, \$193 in 1971; Joseph Forbes (D-Oak Park) \$2,461 for 1972, \$2,992 in 1971; Raymond Smit (R-Ann Arbor) \$3,567 for 1972, \$623 in 1971; James Tierney (D-Garden City) \$891 for 1972, \$77 in 1971; and Richard Young (D-Deborn Heights) \$2,283 for 1972 and \$1,824 in 1971.

Gd. River Repair Bids Asked

The State Highway Dept. will take bids Aug. 21 on two repair projects for Grand River Ave. in Livonia, Redford Township and northwest Detroit.

Estimated total price is \$3,000, and scheduled completion date is November. The projects are:

- Intermittent curb replacement, joint and gutter repair on eastbound Grand River from Colegate Ave. in Livonia southeast about three miles to the Rouge River, including some repairs at Appleton Street.

- The same kind of work on westbound Grand River along with additional curb and gutter repair east of Shawwassee and east of Seven Mile.

SS Benefit Hike Worth \$373 Million

Social Security benefit payments to residents of Michigan will be increased by a total of \$373 million in calendar year 1973 as a result of the 20 per cent benefit increase passed by Congress and signed into law by President Nixon on July 1, said Sam F. Test, district manager of the Detroit-Northwest Social Security Office.

In 1973, the first full calendar year during which the higher benefits will be payable, the 1,129,000 social security beneficiaries in Michigan will receive a total of over \$2 billion in benefits, compared to the estimated \$1.8 billion they would have been paid if the 20 per cent increase had not been enacted.

The first checks to include the 20 per cent increase will reach beneficiaries in the Detroit area on Oct. 3, the regular date for the delivery of checks covering benefits for September - the month for which the increase is effective. Test said that beneficiaries need not take any action because the increase will come to them automatically.
