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The couple will live in East Lansing, where the bridegroom is a student at Michigan State University.

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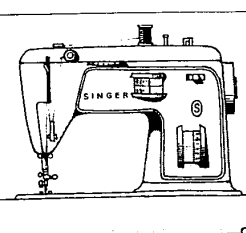
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
