Federal Police Grant To Fund 4 New Cadets

The Farmington Police Department will allow the Farmington Township Police to add four cadets to a new training program and continue a traffic safety program for another year, according to Public Safety Director Ronald Holko.

The department received a \$22,000 grant for a cadet training program.

Naturalists Hear Expert On Butterfly

The monthly meeting of the Farmington Area Naturalists will be Monday, 8 p.m., Aug. 28, at the Farmington Community Center, 24705 Farmington Rd.

The evening speaker will be Edward W. Keith of Windsor, Ontario.

His subject will be the Monarch Butterfly. He will present an illustrated program on the life cycle of the Monarch, the banding of this butterfly, and the final returns of the banding. Through these studies a migration pattern has been established.

Keith is presently employed as an accountant with Chrysler of Canada. He is a member of many Canadian and American Scientific Associations. He is an active bird bander and is presently banding the Monarch Butterfly as a researcher for the University of Toronto.

2 Subdivisions To Be Paved

Contracts for streets in two subdivisions in Farmington Township have been awarded, according to the Oakland County Road Commission.

Improvements are slated on unpaved sections of Independence, Sedalia, Elm, Byron, Ontario and Rensselaer in Grand River Crest No. 2 subdivision.

Eleven Kendallwood streets will also be repaved.

Total cost of the projects is \$55,000, according to the road commission, 80 per cent paid by property owners and 20 per cent shared by the road commission and the township.
