The Oakland County Board of Canyassers Tuesday certified results of the Aug. 8 primary, establishing Pontiac attorney Julian A. Cook as the fourth place finisher in the preliminary.

Reid, who was thought to have won the fourth place slot by a mere six votes over Cook, was discovered to have actually lost 15,552 to 15,498 when counting errors were found by the canvassers board.

Reid has until Monday to demand a recount,
