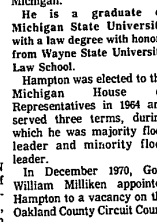

Three North Farmington High School students were among the 15,000 national semi-finalists in the 1973 National Merit Scholarship program.

Rated as the most academically talented high school seniors, they will compete for 3,000 merit scholarships to be awarded in 1973.

A national merit \$1,000 scholarship will be awarded to 1,000 students. Many of the students will also be considered for a renewable four-year merit scholarship.

Six Harrison High students have been awarded letters of commendation for their high performance on the 1971 Preliminary Scholastic Aptitude Test and National Merit Scholarship qualifying test. These students are among the upper two per cent of those who are expected to graduate from high school in 1973.
