

*The contract was for one year, although the school board had sought a three-year pact. It was the third single-year pact for the 160 teachers.

*Starting pay for teachers with a BA degree will be raised to \$8,500, about 2.2 per cent more than last year's \$8,320. The 1970 pay level was \$8,000.

*Peachers with a BA degree will receive \$14,100 in the 11th step of experience.

*Beginning teachers with the MA degree will receive \$9,200.
