Continued from Page 1C prices would fall by 25 per cent, or more. Our three biggest suppliers of ready-made cereals are Kellogg, General Mills and General Foods. If these companies had some competition, the lower prices could save the consumer \$150 million a year.

**ON CRIME:** "Our jails are splitting at the seams, and we know from studies that confinement does little or nothing to help either society or the offender." (Mrs. Wolfgang advocates putting tax money into half-way houses, such as Share House, a project she helped organize in the Detroit area for re-education and training.)

**ON VIETNAM:** "We've spent \$500 million there in the last three months, and they tell us there are insufficient funds to solve crime in the streets. Our strategy has been to keep on punishing them until they give up. If you can buy that 'peace with honor' business and vote for the logic of the torture chamber, you are either remarkably ignorant or remarkably callous."

On the U.S. policy towards Israel: She reverted to Jewish and the pearls shock.

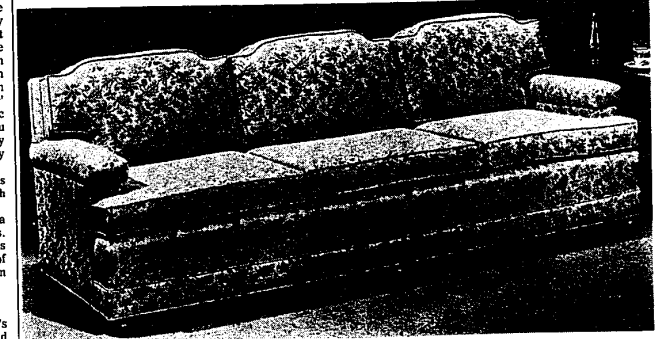

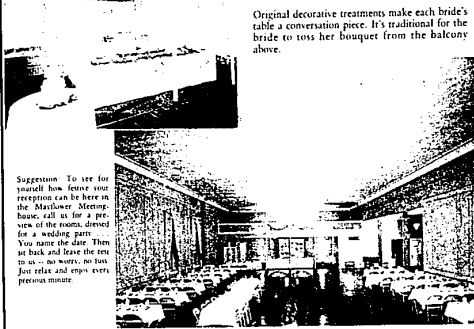
