In preparation for the fall season, the band held a summer camp from Aug. 28 through Sept. 2 at Camp Sea Gull on Lake Charlevoix.

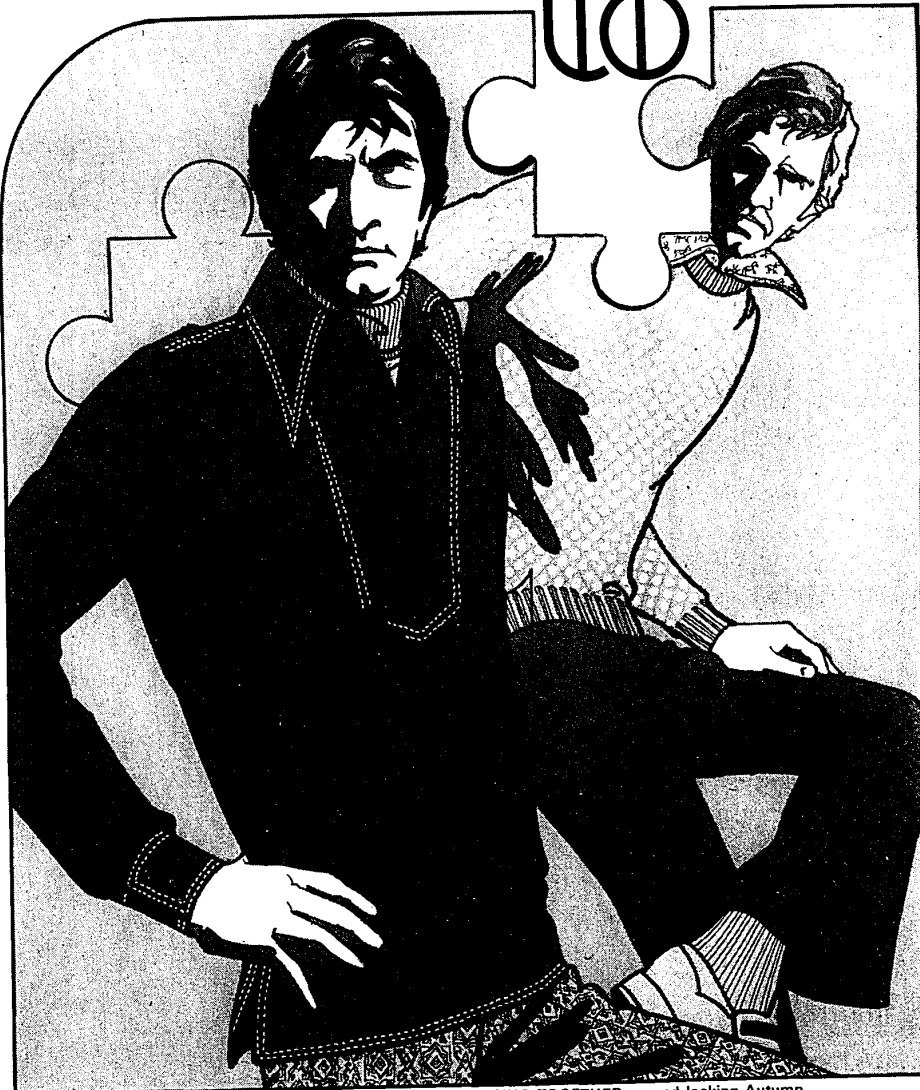
While there, the students were given instruction in the fundamentals of marching and playing through sectionals, rehearsals and drills.
