

Catholic 'First' Involves Deacon From Livonia

William Lenny, married deacon who was a Livonian until last weekend, now is filling an unprecedented role in the Catholic Church.

The Rev. Lenny on Oct. 1 began his duties as associate pastor of two neighboring parishes in the rural area near Norwalk, Ohio.

And he and his wife and four children are getting settled in the rectory of Mother of Sorrows Catholic Church of North Auburn, until now a home to priests rather than youngsters.

REV. LENNY, ordained in June 1971, after two years of study in the Detroit Archdiocese Diaconate program, also will be working with the Toledo Diocese to help set up a program for training married men as deacons, or helpers to priests, in that area.

"To my knowledge," Rev. Lenny told the Observer in a telephone interview from North Auburn, "it's the first time that a married deacon has served as an assistant pastor."

His role is to assist the Rev. Omar Reithinger, senior pastor to both Mother of Sorrows and St. Bernard parish in New Washington, Ohio.

He will work with the parochial schools operated by both parishes and will assist Rev. Reithinger in all capacities except saying mass.

WHILE STEPPING into a brand new position in the Catholic church that has seen its priesthood shrinking in numbers in recent years, Rev. Lenny sees the move as a natural one for him and advantageous to all involved. While living in Michigan,

Rev. Lenny and his family made their home in Livonia but attended church in St. Bridgid in northwest Detroit. In his capacity as a deacon, he assisted in the parish of St. Thomas Aquinas at Ford and Evergreen in Detroit, and he was employed as a religious education director by St. Catherine Catholic parish in Algona.

"I had to cover a lot of territory," he said.

In addition, he felt his training and capabilities as a deacon were not being put to the best use in a city parish

to St. Bernard, taking over spiritual leadership of both parishes.

"That led to an empty house and a need for an assistant in two parishes," Rev. Lenny said. He had been talking to the Toledo diocese about the possibility of a move, so it was suggested that he come in the dual capacity.

"The parish council at Mother of Sorrows agreed," he said. "There was no opposition. There are 14 members to the rectory and I voted to bring me in and the other didn't vote because he said he didn't quite understand the move."

ALTHOUGH the area tends to be conservative and the move is pretty revolutionary for the Catholic church, Rev. Lenny said his new parishioners "couldn't be more friendly."

"Everyone has been just great," he reported, adding that women in the parish were quick to appear with some homebaked goodies for the first family to occupy the rectory.

The two older Lenny children, Colleen, 11, and Sean, nine, are students at St. Bernard school that runs from third through eighth grades. Seven-year-old Timothy attends Mother of Sorrows, where there are only grades one and two. Bright, youngest occupant of the rectory, is 2½.

REV. LENNY, who left the insurance business five years ago to become a religious education director, feels the new position is his best opportunity yet to serve his church to fullest capacity.

He and others in the Toledo diocese are well aware a lot of eyes will be on the little corner of Ohio in the next few months. "That's always happens when you try something different," said his new associate pastor.
