

Welcome Wagon Fall Fashion Show Will Aid Retarded

Last year, using proceeds from the show, the Welcome Wagon was able to give \$500 to Bobby Lariviere, a 22-year-old with limited mental ability who has been in the workshop several years.

William F. Ebert, Livonia branch manager for the league, said the donation enabled the young man to remain under its constant guidance.

"Bobby is one of the original clients from the old Community Opportunity Center housed in the building before the league took over," he said. "He adjusts well to a sheltered workshop situation and there would never be any thought of placing this client in open competitive employment."

Along with the dinner and fashion show, those who attend the Oct. 25 gala will be eligible to win a large assortment of donated prizes.
