

Farmington Democratic Headquarters Is Open

FARMINGTON The Farmington Democratic Headquarters has been opened at 3312 Grand River, above the Sight and Sound Shop.

Hours will be 10 a.m. to 9:30 p.m., Monday through Friday, 10 a.m. to 7 p.m. on Saturday and 11 a.m. to 5 p.m. on Sundays.

The area of responsibility for the headquarters will be Farmington Novi, Northville and Wixom.

ANN SIPHER, area coordinator for Democratic Presidential Candidate George McGovern said the primary function of the headquarters will be to recruit volunteers to "hit the streets" in order to inform voters on how McGovern stands on issues.

Canvassing workshops will be conducted at the headquarters to inform volunteers on the issues and how to accurately answer questions asked by residents on McGovern policy.

She said that even though Nixon support is wide in the area, it isn't deep. By canvassing every house in Oakland County, they hope to make people understand what McGovern really thinks.

With an attack on the Nixon Administration, Democrat Martha Griffiths, 17th District U.S. Representative, opened the headquarters.

Mrs. Griffiths, who is a member of the House Ways and Means Committee, said Nixon is lying when he says there will not be a tax increase in the next four years if he is re-elected.

She said that under the Nixon Administration the United States has accumulated one-fourth of the nation's entire debt adding that the nation has spent \$100 billion more than it has taken in.

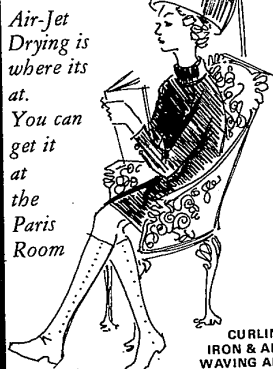
