C'ville Board To Get Budget

A 1972-73 budget anticipating total revenue of \$3,922,130 and expenditures of \$3,950,585 will be presented for study at the Clarenceville Board of Education's Thursday meeting. The meeting will begin at 7:30 p.m. in the board office.

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The \$28,450 overexpenditure can be met from an \$85,000 surplus left from last year, Supt. David McDowell said.

"We don't build up debts, and we have never tried to build up big surpluses," he said. The resulting budget will allow maintenance of the district's full program of study.

A public hearing will be scheduled later to gain citizen comment before a final budget is adopted.

Despite a drop in enrollment of 160 pupils, state aid will remain about the same, \$1,251 million compared with last year's \$1,243 million, McDowell estimated.

The biggest chunk of the \$245,000 revenue increase over last year's \$3,677,470 total will come from local taxes, although federal funding also will jump about \$50,000 over last year.

The increase in local income will result from a higher property evaluation in the district, not from any tax increase, McDowell explained.

"The really big difference is being made up locally," he said, "although we will pick up a considerable amount more from the federal government."
