

'Christmas Special' For Indians

About a month ago, an Indian family of 10 was burned out of its home in the Muskegon area; nothing was saved. Arriving home, the father suffered a heart attack and is not yet able to work. An Observerland group came to the rescue with gifts of clothing, and it is planning three more pre-Christmas trips to aid Indians in Michigan.

IT IS THE Indian affairs committee of the Western Wayne County Conservation Assn. Chairman Hank Chrusciel and his wife do much of the collecting and repair work in their home at 15345 Brentwood, Livonia, but increasing numbers of local persons and groups are joining the project.

Canned food and good clothing would be welcomed to help complete the load for the Harbor Springs Indian Mission school and also to help the needy in the Muskegon area," said Chrusciel. "At present, we are loading a 20-foot semi donated by ITI Truck Driving School destined for the Sault Ste. Marie area. We are going together with Ed Oprinski of Detroit, who has been helping the Indians for some 10 years.

"This will be a 'Christmas special' because we are sending more than 1,100 new toys for the children, plus candy which has been donated by the Sanders company through Bruno Gerlich of Westland."

CHURCH GROUPS, businesses, clubs and individuals have all been making gifts for the three trips to Harbor Springs, Muskegon and the Soo, said Chrusciel.

Salem United Church of Christ, Farmington, donated 340 cans of food, 60 cans of soft drinks, 87 bars of soap, five large boxes of soap powder, used clothing and \$80 for gasoline for the Dec. 15 trip to Harbor Springs.

Mrs. Daniel Wisner's Senior Girl Scout Troop 2130 donated 34 cans of food, nine new pairs of mittens, and gloves, coloring books and crayons. Model Products of Utica donated three dozen model cars.

Food and clothing are coming from the Ford Motor Girls Club, Indian Guides and Maidens of the Livonia Family Y, Sacred Heart Byzantine Church and Cub Pack 832 of Jefferson School, Livonia.

Several vacuum cleaners and radios have been repaired by members of Church of the Holy Spirit, Westland, Alex Roths of Taylor and Don Pollard of Livonia donated money for a soft drink treat for all the children at the Indian mission school.

Scout Tad Taggard of Plymouth collected food, clothing and bicycles as his service project for his eagle rank. He is the second scout to perform that kind of service project.

Ice sculptures, special decorations, chop sticks, miniature fans and live entertainment will round out the evening.

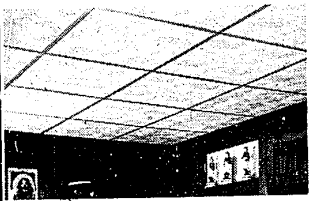
