

Who's Got Those New Lottery Licenses?

Tickets will go on sale Nov. 13 for Michigan's new weekly lottery, and a 36-man staff is criss-crossing the state handing out licenses to some 7,000 business places where the tickets can be sold. But where those places are, the Bureau of State Lottery couldn't exactly say late this week.

The master list was fed to a computer, explained Dave Hanson of the bureau staff, where it is being digested and hopefully will show out by Monday.

A random check turned up five locations in Observerland where lottery

tickets may be purchased, the most unusual Redford Township Hall. Idyl Wyld Golf Course claims it got the first license issued in Livonia. The Mayflower Hotel and McAllister's Grocery in Plymouth report they have been licensed. So does Samhat Bros. liquor store in Redford.

The first preliminary drawing will be Friday, Nov. 24, and subsequent drawings Thursdays.

Besides licensing the ticket sellers, licenses are being distributed to about 100 banks who will service the sales agents.

Judd Attacks Mrs. Griffiths' Campaigning

Ralph Judd, Republican candidate in the 17th Congressional District, called a press conference last week but failed to get attention from the press.

Judd, who is running against U.S. Rep. Martha Griffiths (D-Detroit), said he intended to announce his positions against abortion and in favor of other issues. His opponent has refused to take a position on abortion saying it is a state ballot issue.

The 17th district includes Redford Township, Farmington City and Township, Southfield, Lathrup Village and northwest Detroit.

JUDD EXPLAINED prior to the conference that he had filed a charge with the Fair Campaign Practices Committee, charging that Mrs. Griffiths violated fair campaign practices.

He has been working on the charge for some weeks but filed it just a week before the election. He made the same charges as did State Rep. Marvin Stempin (D-Livonia) against U.S. Rep. Marvin Esh (R-Ann Arbor) in the 2nd district in mid-September.

Judd charged that Mrs. Griffiths is representing herself as an incumbent in Farmington and Redford despite the fact that U.S. Rep. Jack McDonald's (R-Waterford) term doesn't expire until December.

He added that she says she's the incumbent in Southfield even though U.S. Rep. William Broomfield (R-Royal Oak) still officially represents those residents.

"She alluded to the fact she is an incumbent and uses it in her literature and ads, using the word 're-elect' in these areas."
