Answer: "The number one priority for Farmington is lack of responsiveness by government to pressing needs in areas of public safety, embracing traffic, parking and residential street protection. Government officials must act as a conduit from township citizens to county and state authorities to eliminate traffic and parking jams on Orchard Lake and Middlebelt Roads, improve subdivision street lighting and reduce unsafe pedestrian situations on roads leading to schools.

Aloofness of township officials from these problems is deplorable and must be ended.

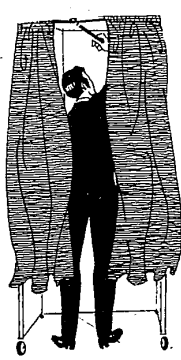
