

Republican Sweep In Final Tallies

FARMINGTON
Final returns in the Farmington Township races put Robert McConnell into the Farmington supervisor's office with 11,223 votes.

Earl Teeples, who conducted an aggressive write-in

campaign, managed to pull 2,557 votes. The closest he came to McConnell was in precinct 1, in the southeast corner of the township, where he was defeated 189 to 248.

Vote totals came in the wee small hours of the morning in the township, where officials were counting a record number of absentee ballots.

ONLY Republicans in local races fared well.

Incumbent Clerk Floyd Cairns defeated challenger Joyce Hungerford, 12,820 to 5,529, in the final tally.

Treasurer Thomas Nolan retained his office by a margin of 12,443 to 5,529 against Catherine Vignoe.

The township trustee finals were: Republican Frederick Lichtman, 12,229; Margaret Schaeffer, 12,432; Democrats Maynard Gordon, 5,555, and Michael Zeglan, 5,214.

District Judge Michael Hand pulled 7,578 votes. He was unopposed, including the primary.

THE RESULTS represented a solid Republican sweep of the township for all offices, national and local, with one exception.

Johannes Spreen defeated Republican candidate Leo Hazen for Oakland County Sheriff 10,719 to 8,625 in the township, 5,027 to 3,022 in the city, a pattern of cross-over repeated often enough to insure Spreen's county-wide victory.

President Nixon won easily against George McGovern, 14,740 to 5,550 in the township and 3,993 to 1,342 in the city.

Frank Kelley proved to be a more popular Democrat than McGovern, although township voters preferred incumbent Sen. Robert Griffin, 13,400 to 5,447, and the city total was 3,765 to 1,514.

U.S. Rep. Martha Griffiths lost locally, although she won the district. In the township, she was defeated by Republican Ralph Judd, 9,657 to 9,413.

State Rep. Raymond Baker

kept his seat in the 64th House district by defeating Democratic challenger John Campbell, 12,126 to 5,747, in the township and 3,343 to 1,420 in the city.

THE LOCAL vote on the propositions did not always follow the state trend, however.

Proposition A, daylight savings time, was approved

15,193 to 4,903 in the township, and 3,850 to 1,409 in the city.

Proposition B, abortion reform, was approved 10,446 to 9,541 in the township, but lost in the city, 2,524 to 2,723.

Proposition C, to limit the property tax for school operations, went down 6,598 to 12,811 in the township, and 1,721 to 3,463 in the city.

Proposition D, to allow a graduated income tax, was even more unpopular, losing 15,397 to 4,092 in the township and 8,957 to 1,155 in the city.

Proposition E, the veterans bonus, was defeated 11,886 to 7,595 in the township and 2,916 to 1,829 in the city.
