Seminary Head To Visit Plymouth

Dr. Bryan F. Archibald, president of Northern Baptist Theological Seminary, will address two evening services Sunday, Nov. 12, in the First Baptist Church of Plymouth, 4500 N. Territorial.

Dr. Archibald will speak for the 6:30 p.m. evening services and for a youth gathering at 7:30 p.m.

The visitor served churches in Massachusetts, New Jersey and Washington, D.C., before being appointed to his present post in 1965. A graduate of Acadia University in Nova Scotia, he earned his doctorate in philosophy from Boston University. He has an honorary degree from Keuka College in recognition of outstanding ministry to youth.

Dr. Archibald is a past president of the Massachusetts Baptist Convention and of the Northern Baptist Education Society, and for 11 years was a member of the American Baptist Convention finance committee.

In Washington, he was chairman of the Baptist Joint Committee on Public Affairs and chaplain of the National Council of American Baptist Men.

He is a native of Cleveland and he and his wife have four grown children.

Plymouth Pastor Plans Return To Holy Land

A Plymouth minister who has worked with two mission programs in Israel is returning there this Christmas season as leader of a holy land tour group.

"We hope to be in Bethlehem on Christmas Eve," said the Rev. J. Paul Brown, minister of the Plymouth Church of Christ, 9301 Sheldon.

Rev. Brown has been part of two mission teams that went to Israel in 1969 and 1972, working mainly with Arabs and Greek Orthodox and reaching a few Jews.

The teams also worked with a high school that had been established about 12 years ago by the Church of Christ in the hills near Nazareth.

The school still is a going concern, and with the "Plymouth" team on the tour visit this December will be a young man who plans to take over soon as its principal.

Working through contacts made in the school, mission team members visited homes, first in 1969 and then in the 1971 follow-up campaign.

"We had to be invited, according to the customs of that land," he said, "but many invitations came through studies.

"We visited homes, conducting Bible study, and led group meetings at night. Thirty-seven were baptized in the first visit, and when we returned two years later we found 32 of them still faithful and this time converted 68 more people."

SPECIAL DIAGRAMS and study charts with bible verses in Arabic were used in the study, he said.

Rev. Brown plans to renew some old acquaintances and make a visit to the high school during his Christmas visit to the area.

The tour group, which still has some openings, will depart Dec. 15, and the \$699 fare will include roundtrip air
