

Honors Given For 'Walk'

FARMINGTON Plaques and "Walk for Mankind" nylon jackets were presented to schools and individuals who earned special thanks in the 22-mile walk at a ceremony Thursday in the North Farmington High School auditorium.

The 150 member audience saw representatives from North Farmington Senior High and Power Junior High schools receive plaques for having the greatest percentage of students complete the walk.

Farmington Senior and East Junior High schools were awarded plaques for collecting the most money.

DONNA BROWN of Behan Junior High School was presented a trophy for collecting more money than any other participant, \$243. Chris Kolbas also received a trophy for collecting the most money of any senior high school student, \$120.

Barnet Dickman, a member of the Farmington Beautification Committee,

received a certificate entitling him to a "Walk for Mankind" jacket for his outstanding sponsor solicitations, more than \$600.

Other individual winners of jacket certificates for collecting the most money at each school were: Laura Bednarsh, Harrison High; Mary Clancey, Mercy High; Lynda Sables, North Farmington High; Jack Mingo, Oakland Community College; Teresa Bradbury, Power Junior High; Mary Smith, Dunckel Junior High; Carol Saunders, Farmington Junior High; and Janis Clements, East Junior High.

TWENTY-SIX schools participated in the walk, with students coming from West Bloomfield, Detroit and many elementary schools in the Farmington area.

The event, sponsored by the Farmington area Jaycees, was to raise funds for Project Concern.

efforts was expressed by Don McKinnon, Farmington Community Center president; Jack Puler, Farmington Area Advisory Council director; and Claire Orion, Youth Employment Service Director.

Thanks also was offered to the walkers and all individuals and organizations involved in

promoting the walk, including the city and township police and the Michigan Emergency Patrol.

A percentage of the proceeds also went to organizations involved.

The program concluded with songs to a guitar accompaniment by Rick Warner.

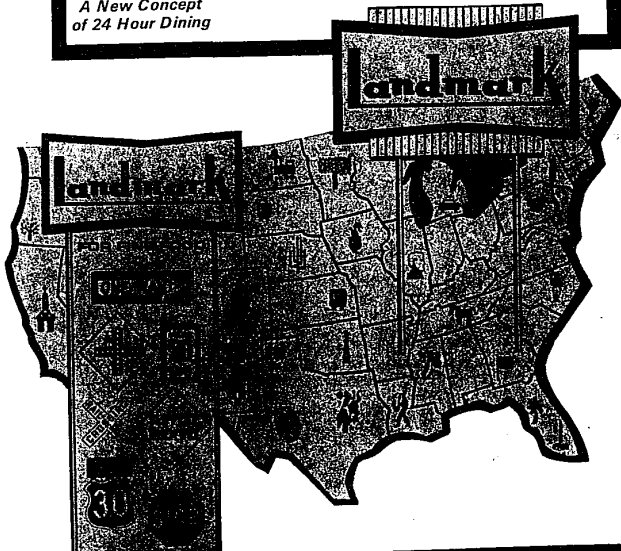

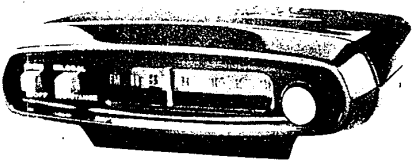
