

Seminars Show Potential

OCC -- Housewife's Friend

It's a rough journey from the kitchen to the college classrooms.

All the anxieties and uncertainties make it a difficult decision to leave the kitchen and role of homemaker for a dubious education and then a job, maybe.

That's why Mary White, a counselor on the Orchard Ridge campus of Oakland Community College, tailored a seminar for women students. The human potential seminar has been offered for all students with the intention of spurring them to think positively and pursue realistic career goals.

COUNSELORS conduct weekly sessions where participants speak openly about their experiences and future plans.

But Mrs. White saw through her counseling that some women have special concerns and anxieties that could better be discussed in an all-women session.

So she pushed for a special seminar, and won permission for a trial run during the fall semester.

The semester is almost over now, and the seminar proved such a success that another one is scheduled for 1:30 p.m. on Thursdays during the winter semester. If more than 15 to 20 women sign up, a second seminar may be scheduled.

Sixteen women, ranging in age from 18 up, participated in the fall seminar, providing an interesting diversity, Mrs. White said.

Although she was apprehensive about the wide age range, Mrs. White said that "whether they are 18 or 60, women have a lot of things in common."

SHE FOUND that the communication between the two generations was generally typified with the older women

more open and direct with a "sureness that the younger women don't have yet," and that the younger women have a greater understanding "about the whole changing value area."

The older women are generally the best students, Mrs. White said, because once they decide to come back to school, they are more serious and determined about their education.

"After 10 years of being fairly isolated, they have lost their confidence in reference to the outside world," she said. "Every woman who returns to school doesn't do it without a whole lot of thought."

"Many have learned a lot through reading, but no one paid much attention to that kind of development."

DURING SEMINARS, the women brainstorm, share experiences and take a realistic look at job opportunities and the job market.

Each participant chose a subject to give a talk on, and the discussions have been scattered throughout the semester.

Subjects range from geriatrics, marriage, childbearing and abortion to attitudes toward life and death, socialization of women, vocational goals, Freudian analysis of women, how to be an independent person, and alternative life styles.

It's not a "hate men" type discussion, Mrs. White emphasized.

Regarding the male-female relationship, "the pitch is more that the common enemy for men and women is the system," Mrs. White said.

"The chance to be ourselves as free human beings is as much a problem for men as for women," she said, adding that the difference is that women must be more aware and take the initiative in challenging the system.

JOB OPPORTUNITIES ranging from vocational to profession are discussed so that the person who just wants

a minimum of training learns as much about job possibilities as does the person who intends to earn a degree.

"I hope to raise their expectations a little by talking about the career possibilities out there," Mrs. White said.
