"I want to win this year but not at the expense of neglecting my responsibility as a coach. If a player doesn't pull his share of the load, he is not going to pull for me

"I guess it all boils down to a matter of principle

in suspending your top players to prove a point.

"I was told that I should let my key players remain in uniform so as to not to hurt the team's

chances of Winning.

"I don't care what anyone else thinks. I run the team and it is hard enough today getting respect from the kids to give in to the idea that to win is all you

should gun for.

"Maybe I won't win on the ice all the time, but I hope to win the challenge of building character. The kids don't all agree with my motives now, but I think they will later in life."


WITH HIS TWO front line goalies suspended. Carinci called on junior Joe Carroll who had not been practicing with the Blue Jays after being cut.
