

GC West Whips Crestwood, 74-50

Garden City West is sporting a low-note 24 basketball record but Coach Chris Babler is happy.

Both wins have been in Tri-River conference competition where the Tigers stand 2-0.

"It has been a funny early season for us," said Babler. "We played a bad opener with Wayne and lost, then dropped a three-pointer to John Glenn,

and as for Ann Arbor Pioneer and Brother Rice, well, we just weren't in those two.

"But we have beaten league favorite Kennedy and now Crestwood," added Babler. "We will be in there to the finish, the kids are gaining confidence."

TRI-RIVER victory No. 2 started with a second quarter

press against Crestwood with West on top, 74-50, at the final buzzer.

It was a 10-10 deadlock after one quarter with West five of 18 from the field and Crestwood, five of 15.

Borgess Captures 1st In 'A'

It took some doing, but Bishop Borgess finally did break into the Catholic Double A win column.

Jim Brisky's Spartan eagles held on in the closing seconds to upend Bishop Gallagher, 61-59, and now sport a 3-5 overall record.

"THE SCORE is no indication of the way the game went," said Brisky.

"We had command all the way but had our moments when nothing would go right."

Borgess jumped to a 11-0 lead in the early moments and led after one quarter, 19-9. Gallagher fought back to trail 32-25 at the half and 50-43 after three quarters.

The Spartans started having trouble at the charity line and, with three minutes remaining,

Gallagher notched it at 51-41. That was the closest Gallagher came to overtaking Borgess, with Mark Sopko hitting twice for the Spartans and Shawn McCarthy once.

GALLAGHER came down to a one-and-one situation with two seconds left and made both, but the buzzer sounded with Borgess up by two.

"We were just terrible at the free throw line," said Brisky. "We missed four one-on-one situations in the fourth period alone."

Borgess finished with a 13 for 39 mark at the line. BORGESS SHOT 36 per cent from the floor with Gallagher a notch off at 35 per cent.

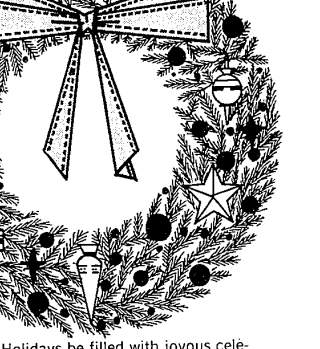
