Northwest Water, Sewer Projects Started Moving

FARMINGTON Water and sewer lines for the northwest corner of Farmington Township will be under construction "within a year," it was announced at Monday's Township Board Meeting.

The "Northwest Pressure District," a water main, and a sewer main running out from Quakertown to the northwest corner of the township were both moved into the paper-work stage Monday when the township board asked the Oakland County to begin preparing contracts and plans on the sewer project. It also asked the township to take bids on the water project.
