

Former Kiwanis President Dies

FARMINGTON — William Wilson, 1956 president of the Farmington Kiwanis Club and formerly active with the Farmington Players, died Tuesday in Grand Rapids where he moved about four years ago. Wilson, who was in his fifties, slipped while cleaning snow from the driveway of his

home, struck his head on a car and died on route to a hospital, Farmington friends said. Memorial services are planned for a date not yet determined. The Wilson family, following a request he made some time ago, ask that memorial donations be sent to the Fortney Clement Foundation for children at University Hospital, Ann Arbor. New Flood Insurance Available

FARMINGTON — Farmington residents interested in the new city flood insurance should contact their insurance agents before Jan. 15. City Manager Robert Deadman told the city council Monday.

Single family structures are insurable up to \$17,500, and other structures up to \$30,000 under the federally subsidized program, he said. Coverage takes place immediately if purchased within the first 30 days after Dec. 15. Afterwards a 15 day waiting period is necessary. Any insurance agent may contact the Insurance Company of North America, Detroit, to get forms and rates. The company is designated as the servicing company for the city of Farmington.

Candidates For Degrees

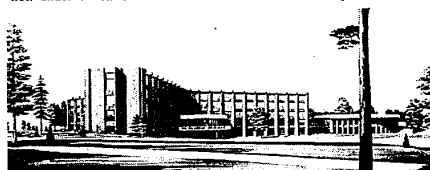
