

"Detroit Edison has imposed an austerity program, including tight spending controls and a hiring freeze. But the company must have additional rate relief." Hartwell said. Last Aug. 18, Detroit Edison received MFSC approval to raise rates by \$45.2 million. But, Hartwell pointed out, this was \$25 million less than the company had requested.
