



## Dateline: Outdoors

Just a few years ago, a Michigan deer hunter could figure he had one chance in five of getting his prey. This year the figure is more like one in 10.

An estimated 59,000 whitetails were killed in the Nov. 15-30 firearm deer season, according to a preliminary estimate by the State Dept. of Natural Resources.

If you figure that 600,000 or more licenses were sold, then the success rate is one in 10 or less. Actually, the number of licenses is less than the number of hunters, but DNR estimates are able to figure that until more complete returns are in.

Oakland County hunting conditions were excellent, and conservation officers said, and the northeast part of Holly Township was one of the best spots.

**THIS YEAR'S** statewide deer kill was down 3,000 from 1971, mostly because the quota of antlerless deer was reduced.

This season's preliminary kill estimate will undergo possible refinements next spring when the DNR completes its annual mail survey of licensed firearm deer hunters.

As the best reading on the season now shapes up, Michigan hunters took 48,500 bucks and 9,500 antlerless animals.

In 1971, they killed 48,190 bucks and 13,700 antlerless deer.

**THIS SEASON'S** antlerless figure, about 31 per cent below last year, largely reflects a virtual ban on antlerless deer hunting in the Upper Peninsula, and a 50 per cent cut in the antlerless quota for northern lower Michigan.

Results of the DNR's traffic counts indicate that Upper Peninsula hunters harvested 10,600 bucks and 500 antlerless animals this season. Their buck kill was about 1,000 shy of the 1971 mark, while the antlerless take for the Upper Peninsula was some 3,200 animals below a year ago.

All of the region's antlerless harvest came from the southern part of Menominee County below Highway US-2, with the rest of the U.P. limited to bucks only hunting.

The DNR's preliminary estimate places the 1972 harvest for northern Lower Michigan at 27,000 bucks and 4,500 antlerless deer. During the 1971 season, hunters in that part of the state took an estimated 26,800 bucks and 6,230 antlerless animals.

COMPARED WITH a year ago, southern Michigan hunters fared the best with their shooting success, taking an estimated 12,500 bucks and 4,500 antlerless deer. Their 1971 harvest stood at 10,200 bucks and 3,810 antlerless animals.

As in the past, this season's traffic survey did not include a count on deer hunter numbers. The size of the state's deer hunter army for 1972 will come into focus after the DNR receives a more complete return on firearm license sales from local dealers.

# One Vote Short Oakland Growth Plan Beaten

PONTIAC In the waning weeks of the present Oakland County administration, it appears members of the board of commissioners are losing their clout. It's a case of "out with the old, in with the new."

Commissioners last week failed to approve growth policies recommended for the county and its 59 communities by a vote of 13-10. It takes 14 votes for passage.

SOUTHFIELD Democrats

Lawrence Pernick and Alex Perinoff were among "yes" voters. Voting "no" was Union Lake Republican Christian Powell.

The policy report, prepared under the auspices of the "Partners in Planning" program, will be considered by the new board when members take office Jan. 1.

William L. Mainland (D-Milford) said it is more important that a "link be established between the old and the new boards than for the present board to lay claim to inauguration of the policy."

"This report is innocuous and superfluous, but its conclusions could be the basis for proposing far-reaching legislation. The planning commission should have the support and involvement of the incoming board. Our successors should consider the growth concepts instead of being handed a fait accompli."

CHARLIE Harrison (D-Pontiac), chairman of the planning and building committee, said it was the responsibility of this board, which asked for the report, to see that the programs are carried out.

"We would be derelict in our responsibilities if we don't support this report. Nobody questions the validity of the program."

Joseph Barakat (D-Madison Heights), said approval would be a vote of confidence to the planning commission, which has been working on the report for two years.
