

## Science Fair Head Picked

**SOUTHFIELD**  
Dr. E. Calvin Johnson has been appointed president of the executive council for the 1973 Science and Engineering Fair sponsored by the Engineering Society of Detroit.

Johnson is vice president of engineering and research for Bendix Corp. of Southfield. Wade Crane, assistant corporate controller for Bendix, will serve as treasurer for the fair.

The fair, held annually for students in southeastern Michigan, is the largest of its kind in the nation involving about 30,000 youth.

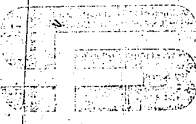

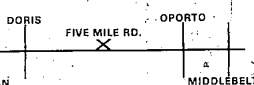
