

Ski-Skule In Full Swing, 2nd Session Coming Up

The Observerland-Livonia first Ski Skule of 1973 got under way last week at Mt. Brighton—but if you missed out on that, one, don't pack away the skis.

Applications are now being taken for the second session, beginning Jan. 25-26 and running through March 2 at Mt. Brighton.

The first session attracted more than 1,000 in the Observerland area and the second session will be a continuation of the first, except for the real beginner.

State wrestling competition is around the corner as the Michigan High School Athletic Association has announced the classes assigned, entertaining schools, competing schools and managers of the 16 District and 14 Regional tournaments.

District Tournament dates are Feb. 24, 25 with regionals set for March 3 for Classes A and B and March 2-3 for Classes C and D.

STATE FINALS for the Lower Peninsula will be held March 9 and 10 — Class A at Grand Rapids Calvin College; Class B at Kalamazoo's Western Michigan University; and Classes C and D at Lansing Waverly High School.

The Upper Peninsula finals will be on March 2 and 3 at Northern Michigan University at Marquette.

The 18 Observerland high schools find themselves in four different district tournaments.

Westland John Glenn joins 18 other schools in the Temperance-Bedford District which includes Adrian, Allen Park, Belleville, Dearborn, Edsel Ford, Fordson, Lincoln Park, Melvindale, Romulus, Southgate Schaller, Southgate, Taylor Kennedy, Taylor Center, Temperance Bedford, Trenton, Wayne, Roosevelt, and Ypsilanti.

Walled Lake Western is site No. 4 in Class A action with 12 Observerland schools filling out a 20 team roster.

Waterford Kettering moved into a 1-2-2 zone and defense and Clarenceville High fell into the basement of the Wayne-Oakland conference cage standings.

Clarenceville led after one quarter, 14-12, with Kettering working out of a man-to-man pattern. Kettering switched to its zone and outscored the now 2-6 Trojans, 49-23, in the remaining three quarters to hand Clarenceville its third league loss, 61-37.
