

## Why SC Students Buzzing This Week

"The Last Drop," located in upper Waterman, will feature "Air Fish" and Dan Tripp on Thursday and Ron Coden, Mike Riley and Tripp on Friday. It opens at 10:30 a.m. each day and closes when the last student leaves.

"FRIDAY 101" is the main event of the week featuring a spaghetti dinner at 5:30 p.m. in Waterman for one cent and entertainment by Coden and Danny Cox beginning at 7:30 p.m. for \$1. Advance tickets for \$1.01 are available in the student activities office. Tickets at the door are \$2.
