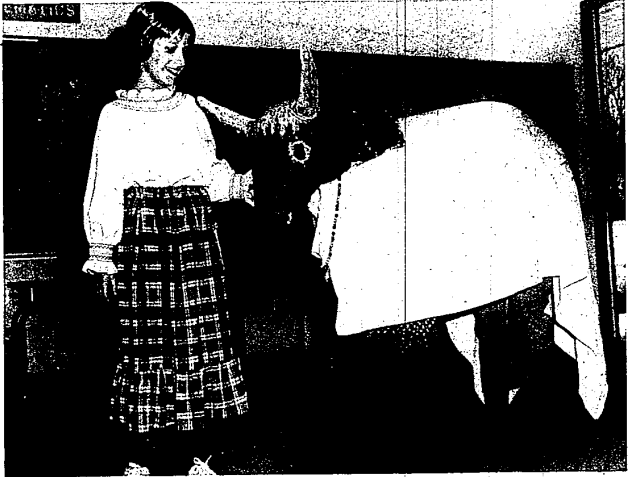

6th Graders Learning Law

FARMINGTON Sixth graders at Bond Elementary School in Farmington will be taking a mini-course in legal education.

They aren't expected to be lawyers when it is over, five lessons later, but they will be expected to know how courts function and some of the procedures involved in arrest, indictment and trial.

They are among 840 sixth graders in Oakland County who will learn in a project funded by the Omnibus Crime Bill. Other districts participating in the legal education project are Lamphere, Oak Park, Oxford, Pontiac, Rochester and Royal Oak.

TEACHING LAW to 11 and 12-year-olds was untried last May. A series of lessons was developed by Mrs. Sadie Ward, project director, and Dr. Myles Platt, director of

social studies for Oakland Schools.

Five hundred sixth graders in seven school districts were tested on their store of legal knowledge, taught the lessons, and then retested. The second round of tests indicated they were interested and capable of learning about law and its effect on citizens.

The tests also pointed up weak spots in the curriculum. It was rewritten and augmented with a film, film strip, slide presentation and cut-out flannel board figures of a court in session. A trip to court is also a part of the instruction.

In December the sixth grade teachers who will use the legal educational curriculum met with Mrs. Ward to review the visual materials and pick up their teachers' manuals.

Barbara Elshenberger will teach the five unit course at the Bond Elementary School.
