

Missionaries To Visit Ward United Church

The program will open with a dinner Wednesday evening. Missionaries will speak in the regularly scheduled classes at 7.

The following day, members of the congregation will entertain the guests in their homes on an informal basis.

THE MISSIONARIES will conduct a talk show centered on the subject "My Most Unusual Experience on the Field."

Stuckey, vice president, Medical Assistance Programs, Inc., Wheaton, Ill.; Robert Mayer, Awana Youth Association, Rolling Meadows, Ill.; Ann Ryno, a teacher at the Arctic Bible Institute, Arctic Missions, Inc., the Rev. Gordon Trev, Presbyterian Mission, Brazil; the Rev. David DeJong, Missionary Tech Team, Spring City, Tenn.; and the Rev. Herman Cross, director of the Afro-American Mission, Detroit.

Dr. Horace L. Fenton Jr. will be the speaker at the three regular Sunday services. Dr. Fenton is general director of the Latin American Mission.

Program Brings Bible Authority, Manuscripts

Rare Biblical books and manuscripts will be displayed and a noted Bible authority will speak for a special program planned at 7 p.m. Sunday, Jan. 21, in North Farmington Baptist Church, 3200 W. 13 Mile.

"The English Bible" is the topic for the program, which also will include a film.

Dr. Thelma James, retired Wayne State University professor, will be the speaker.

SHE WILL tell of early English translations of the Bible and show how the history of the printed editions has influenced the course of Christianity from the Middle Ages to the present.

The film to be shown in conjunction with her talk is "Formation of the Bible."

Gloria Frances, rare book curator for the Detroit Library, has selected the Biblical material, books and manuscripts for the special display.

INCLUDED will be an original leaf from the first edition of the King James Bible, printed in 1611, and original pages from the Aitken Bible, the only edition to be officially authorized by the U.S. Congress in 1872.

Facsimiles of the Gutenberg Bible, printed around 1450 and the first large book printed with movable type, will be exhibited, and there also will be a 1905 Dove Press Bible valued for its fine design and printing excellence.

The Rev. Stanley Nichol, North Farmington Baptist pastor, said the program and exhibit would be open to the public.

"We are pleased to bring this interesting program to the Farmington community," he added.

"It will be an unusual opportunity for Biblical scholars and rare book enthusiasts to add to their knowledge of Christian history as well as the development of printing technology from the 1400s to the present."
