Haight illustrated his talk with color slides taken on various trips to Utah, Colorado, New Mexico, and Arizona to study sites of ancient Indian habitations.

**HAIGHT**, a high school teacher in Dearborn for more than 20 years, was honored as that city's Citizen of the Year in 1966.

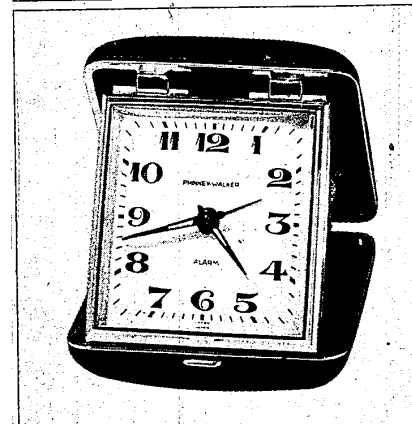
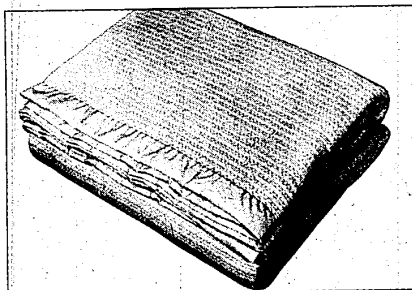
