## Missionaries Tell Of Congo, Philippines

Mission work in China, the Philippines and Zaire, formerly the Congo, will be described during the annual Missions Conference at the First Baptist Church of Plymouth Sunday, Jan. 28, to Thursday, Feb. 1.

REV. STABELL will speak at 7 p.m. Tuesday, Jan. 30, and Wednesday, Jan. 31, and for the Women's Missionary Fellowship luncheon at 12 noon Thursday, Feb. 1. He went to Zaire in 1955 to establish a mission at Monaza. Under his leadership, churches in that area have doubled, and he continues to supervise them as well as heading new work started in Kimpata, Katika and Tono. As part of the conference, the women's fellowship have set up missionary displays in various parts of the church.

## Catholics Urged To Boycott Lettuce

Catholics in the Detroit Archdiocese have been asked to support United Farm Workers in California and Arizona by joining the lettuce boycott.

Cardinal John F. Dearden, Auxiliary Bishops Thomas J. Gumbleton and Walter J. Schoenher and archdiocesan vicars recently adopted a resolution supporting the workers.

It urged "all Catholic parishes, institutions and organizations" to refuse to buy non-union lettuce.

CARDINAL Dearden implied that the issue deserved the kind of attention Catholics have given to the fight against legalized abortion.

He expressed hope that pastors and parish Christian Service commissions would bring the cause of the United Farm Workers to the attention of their people.

"The immediate issue," he declared, "is the lettuce workers' right to bargain collectively, a right denied in traditional Catholic teaching and reaffirmed by the Second Vatican Council.

"It is confident that the many Archdiocesan Catholics who expressed their concern for human life by working and voting against abortion on demand in Michigan will support the lettuce workers' struggle for a truly human life in the case is presented to them."

Limb was born in Nisinoiwa, Japan, of Korean parents. He attended university there and received a BA in economics. He was awarded the General MacArthur Trophy as the top orator in a national inter-collegiate oratorical contest, and while still a student, was appointed president of the Reishikan Gakuin Institute, an English language college.

Limb came to the U.S. in 1955 and received an MA (degree in religion from Harding College, Memphis, Tenn., an MA in psychology from George Peabody College, Nashville, Tenn., and a BD degree from Vanderbilt University. While attending Vanderbilt, he met and married Shirley Willcott of Hueytown, Ala.

They have three daughters. LIMB SERVED several churches in Tennessee and Alabama and conducted a regular television lecture in Decatur, Ala. He also served as mission evangelist for the Druid Hills Church of Christ, Atlanta, Ga. He and his family returned to Japan in 1964 to begin an eight-year mission tour. They returned to the U.S. last December and are now residing in Walnut Creek, Calif.
