The workshop is being sponsored by the Girl Scouts of Metropolitan Detroit, under the supervision of Ivy Reed, director of program development, and Patt Stanton, field executive.

"THERE ARE more than 80 troops in our council with one or more handicapped girls as members," said Mrs. Reed. "Many of the leaders who work with these girls have not had any previous experience in dealing with exceptional youngsters."

"In the workshop, we will attempt to provide them with special training and valuable resource information."
