# Allen Park Stifles Bentley Rally, 66-61

In Livonia Bentley's basketball history, having the game's leading scorer, outshooting the opponent from the floor as a team and outbounding the foe have been ingredients which usually guaranteed victory for the Bulldogs at Allen Park, however, as the Jaguars raced to a 20-9 lead in the first quarter and then stifled a late Bentley rally to win, 66-61.

Tim Bollin had his best scoring night of the season, the 6-9 senior center pacing Bentley with 32 points. His game - leading 16 rebounds helped the Bulldogs to a 47-42 edge in that department, and in field goals Bentley had a 26-23 margin. None of that was enough.

The Bulldogs contributed to their own downfall with ragged ball handling early in the game, couldn't get their

offense untracked until too late, and never did find the range at the free throw line. It was there that Allen Park really turned killer, outscoring Bentley, 20-9.

That made it nine in a row in the Suburban Eight for the first place Jaguars and boosted their season's mark to 13-2.

For Bentley it was the sixth loss in the last seven games, dropped the Bulldogs to a fifth place 4-4 in the league and left the overall mark at 6-8.

GEARED TO concentrate on stopping Allen Park's 6-11 Tom Agardy, the Bulldogs found instead that the biggest threat in their sides was a sharpshooting 6-2 junior forward, Jim Perry.

Agardy picked up three personals in the first three minutes and was used sparingly thereafter, playing

a total of only 12 minutes. Perry, meanwhile, was popping them in from all angles to run up a career high of 30 points for the all-Jaguar team that went to the state Class A quarterfinals last winter.

After trailing 30-25 at the half and 47-41 for three periods, Bentley stormed to within three points of the Jaguars behind the shooting of Bollin, Brent Bogler, Eric Bracke and Bob Deacon.

A Bracke bucket cut it to 58-55 with 1:40 remaining, but four quick Jaguar points by Agardy and Perry pushed it to 62-55.

Again the Bulldogs came on, Bollin and Deacon combining to make it 62-59 in the closing minute, but Bollin then fouled out and what scoring remained was at the foul line.

Bentley will have Belleville as a home foe Friday, hoping
