Rocks Knock Off Dearborn, 63-55

It took Plymouth three periods to assert firm command in a slow tempo basketball battle with Dearborn, but from there the Rocks went on to a 63-55 triumph that boosted their season's record to 11-4.

The victory moved Plymouth into third place in the Suburban Eight at 6-4, while Dearborn slumped to sixth at 2-7.

Conceding that the race for the league title is now strictly between Allen Park and Redford Union, Rock Coach Fred Thomann stresses that "our goal is to finish strong and to have momentum going

for us in the state tournament."

"We expected Dearborn to hang tough on its own court," he added. "It's a club that sits on the ball, often taking eight or nine seconds to get to the center line and then working it in for the good shot. We had to change our own tempo and it took a while to get adjusted."

THE ROCKS were limited to 55 shots from the floor in contrast to their customary 70 or more. However, they got 50 per cent marksmanship from their three top scorers of the night, Ron Egloff, Kevin Moore and Steve Robb. Together, this trio connected on 20 of 40 attempts.

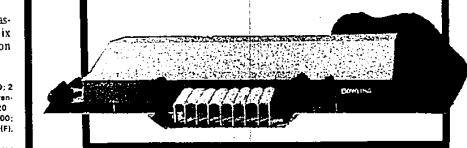
