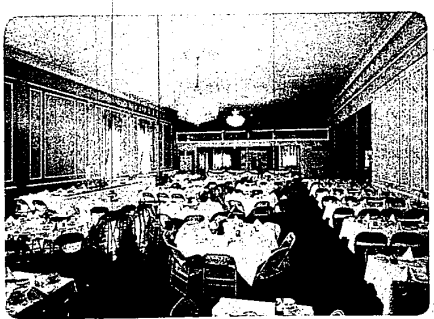
The book will be available at \$1.25 post-paid, as well as through women's clubs and organizations.
