Earth Alive Anticipates Recycling

FARMINGTON Regional organization is the only effective way to handle recycling efforts, according to Nancy Kourjian, member of the Farmington Township solid waste committee.

Mrs. Kourjian, a member of the Earth Alive program, which operates a paper collection center near Dunced Junior High School on 12 Mile, says the road toward a regional recycling system is a long way in the future, but believes the establishment of the township committee is a step in the right direction.

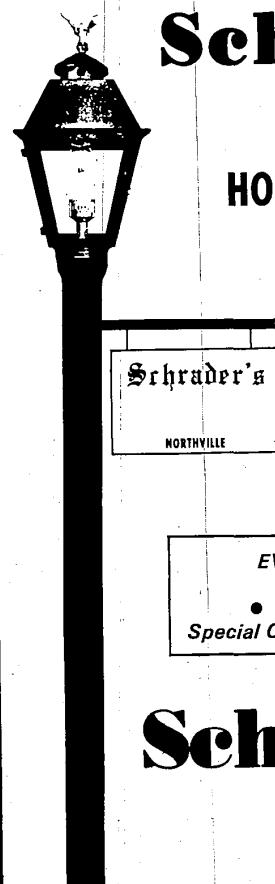
