



Livonians Hear Of Africa Mission

A former missionary in Africa, the Rev. Walter D. Cardwell will speak at services in Livonia Christian Church, Disciples of Christ, 36075 Seven Mile, on Sunday, Feb. 18.

He will be heard at the morning worship service at 9:30 and at the church's annual "Week of Compassion" dinner at 6 p.m. His topic for the latter will be "Helping to Mend Our Broken World."

Rev. Cardwell is executive secretary of the office of interpretation for the Division of Overseas Ministries of the Christian Church, Disciples of Christ.

A native of Louisville, Ky., he graduated from Transylvania College and Lexington Theological Seminary, both in Lexington. He was pastor of churches in Kentucky and Mississippi before volunteering for service abroad.

He and his wife attended the Kennedy School of Missions, Hartford, Conn., and after their appointment to the Republic of Zaire in Africa they studied French in Montreal, Que.

They served in Zaire from 1945 to 1958. Rev. Cardwell was legal representative of the Disciples of Christ and taught at the Ecole des Predicateurs (Preachers' School) in Bolegne. In 1952, he was chosen director of the preacher training school at the Zaire Christian Institute. He was also engaged in evangelistic work and served on the Zaire Protestant Council.

Rev. and Mrs. Cardwell have five children.

Adas Shalom To Begin Classes For Teenagers

Adas Shalom Synagogue in Farmington is beginning a five-week program of formal and informal experiences in Jewish education for students in the ninth through 12th grades.

The classes will be held from 10 until 12 Sunday mornings, beginning Feb. 25, in the synagogue, 29901 Middle Belt. There will be no session on March 11.

The program is entitled a "Minister for Teenagers."

Each morning's program will consist of two formal class hours in which students may choose one of three courses:

Rabbi Jacob E. Segal will teach a course on "Bialik: The Stories and Poems of a Genius and Hero of the Jewish People."

Rabbi Seymour Rosenbloom will teach "Jewish Prayer: The Contemplation of an Individual and an Institution."

Tzvi Berkai will teach "A Jewish View of Contemporary Affairs."

There will be a half-hour break for refreshments, seeing a short film or talking

with an outside guest from the community.

"WE ARE TROUBLED by the fact that many of our high school students are not involved in any program of Judaic studies," said Rabbi Segal, spiritual leader of Adas Shalom.

"We want to get them involved, even if, at this time, it will only be in the short, but intensive, format of the

minister. We are confident that once they taste this pleasure of learning, they will be willing to undertake a fuller program next year."

While directed toward the children of members, it is open to all teenagers in the area. There will be a \$3 registration fee per student.
