# **New Administrators?**

Schoolcraft College President C. Nelson Grote proposed an administrative restructuring Monday that would add two new positions and change the chain of command.

wo use possuous and change the chain Recognizing that his proposals are dependent on the budget. Dr. Grote also included options of adding just one administrator or just realigning positions. In a detailed presentation during a board stighy session, Dr. Grote outlined both long and short-range plans. These were the first recommendations he has made on the administrative structure since betoming college president in June of 1971.

"FROM MY vantage point as the chief administrator, we could adequately justi-fy 35 administrators (currently there are 31) for the 1973-74 college year," Grote

"Realizing the financial and political constraints. I am recommending a total of 30 or two additional positions and a new configuration as a result of transfers. "If necessary, we can get by with one additional position, and if absolutely mendatory, we can continue with 31 new positions in a new configuration. "To reduce the total aggregate number of administrators for 1937-74 would in my ludgment, be detrimental to the institution as we attempt to accomplish our stated purposes."

The new positions would be (1) director of information and service centers

The new positions would be (1) director of information and service centers and (2) director of institutional planning and research. His proposals would also upgrade the position of director of community services (o. a dean's spot and downgrade the position of business manager to manager of business services. An apparent concession to the faculty's criticism of a middle administrative layer of area directors. Dr. Grote would elimi-

nate the position of director of apprenticeships and make the director of social science a part - time position.

AN "EXECUTIVE" (secret) session was held Tuesday night for a discussion between Dr. Grote and board members on the restructuring as it relates to specific employes and their performances.

The long-range plans move toward isolating the presidency. An executive vice president would be placed directly under the president with the other administrators reporting to the executive vice n resident.

Richard Arlen, president of the Faculty Forum bargaining unit, distributed a faculty evaluation of the instructional administrative structure.

The faculty report concludes "there is a serious deterioration over the past three years in communications and meaningful relations with the administration.
