Home Nursing Course Is Free

The Michigan Cancer Foundation and the American Red Cross will sponsor an eight-week course in home nursing for the seriously ill patient beginning Wednesday, Feb. 28.

Classes will be held every Wednesday at 9:30 a.m. for two hours in the American Red Cross office, S. Telegraph at Oxford, Dearborn. They will run for eight weeks.

The course is open to all and there is no charge. However advance reservations must be made by calling the MCF, 1112 N. Telegraph, Dearborn, any weekday between 10 a.m. and 4 p.m.

The class is limited to 20 students and reservations are accepted on a first-come, first-served basis.

The objectives of this course are summarized in comments from recent graduates.

Mrs. Beverly Pike of Dear-

born Heights said, "My grandfather died last year of cancer. I felt so helpless because I didn't know what to do to make him comfortable. Now I'm getting prepared for such a situation, just in case."

"Seeing things done for patients has helped me a lot," said Mrs. Mildred Porter of Detroit. "I like to help care for sick people. I might even be called upon to care for one of my 27 grandchildren."

The course is taught by especially trained registered nurses. The first six classes are devoted to care methods for any seriously ill person. The last two zero in on special aspects of care for cancer patients.

The course is offered as a special service by the Red Cross and the MCF. Both organizations receive major financial support from the United Fund.

Panel To Discuss 'Abused Child'

"The Abused Child - Revisited" is the title of a panel discussion to be held Thursday, March 8, from 1 to 2:30 p.m. in Children's Hospital Auditorium, 3901 Beaubien, Detroit.

There is no admission charge to the program, which will be presented by the Women's Auxiliary of Children's Hospital.

"The abused child is a phenomenon that is occurring all too frequently," said Mrs. Marvin Hill, publicity chairman for the auxiliary. "Help is needed - both for the abused and those driven to abuse."

"In an effort to shed light and hope in this area, the auxiliary sponsored a panel discussion this past November."

"This panel will touch on phases of child abuse that the first panel did not cover and would, therefore, be of interest both to new audiences and those who attended the November meeting," she said.


